To avoid confusion, organizations and individuals are earnestly requested to observe the above order of formation.

Route

Parade will form and proceed to Main St., East on Main to Episcopal Church. Turning, thence west on Main St. At first stroke of Reformed Church bell the formation will pause on Main St. while memorial wreath in memory of our lost boys will be attached to service flag, during this pause gentlemen are requested to remove their hats. When bell ceases to toll parade will proceed to James St. through John St., thence to St. Peter's Cemetery. On entering Marshal will turn to right. Mounted Police on reaching entrance will turn to left followered by remainder of line meeting at rear of Cemetery, columns will march abreast through Central Ave., returning toward entrance. Pause of 15 minutes, singing and address by Rev. Father Higgins.

Proceeding thence to Rosendale Plains Cemetery and entering Marshal will turn to left. State Police on reaching entrance to the right, on meeting at rear of Cemetery, columns will march abreast returning toward entrance through Central Ave. Pause of twenty minutes, singing, address by Rev. Mr. Cameron, prayer by Rev. Mr. Simmons. Marshal will then proceed, State Police and remainder of line falling in, to place of starting where parade will be disbanded.

Luncheon will be served for Veterans and returned soldiers in uniform at St. Peter's Hall at 12:30 P. M.

Singing and music by the Band on School Green at 2 P. M.

At 2:30 P. M., John E. Hardenbergh, Esq., will introduce the orator, HON. JAMES JENKINS, OF KINGSTON, N. Y.

In the evening by courtesy of the proprietor, soldiers in uniform each accompanied by a lady will be admitted free to the Rosendale Casino for the moving pictures and following dance.
