
DESTRUCTIVE FIRE AT NEWARK.—A destructive fire broke out between 12 and 1 o'clock to-day, in the buildings of the Rosendale Lime and Cement Co.'s Works, on the Passaic River. The main building, of three stories high, and a long wing, were entirely consumed. The engines saved the numerous adjoining sheds and buildings. The heat of the flames, and the sparks carried by a high wind, set on fire the grass on the meadows on the opposite side of the river. The origin of the fire could not be ascertained, as there has not been, it is stated, any fire used about the building nor at the engine since Friday, except at the kilns, which are the opposite end from the wing where the flames were first discovered. A large amount of property, including machinery, stock, &c., was injured or destroyed, \$7,500 of which is covered by insurance in four New-York Companies.—*Newark Daily, Tuesday.*
