KINGSTON. N. Y., Dec. 27.-The mountain near the Wallkill Valley, Railroad Bridge at Rosendale at 10:30 last night caved in, causing a terrific noise and arousing the entire village from slumber. Some of the inhabitants were terror-stricken. Houses shook and windows rattled. The slide is greater than that of a week ago, when the canal and the road were completely blockaded. It is not believed the railroad bridge has been damaged. The cave-in was caused by the slide of a week ago, when rocks weighing thousands of tons were left in a very dangerous position. The quarry is known as the Smith quarry, and is owned by the New York and Rosendale Cement Company.
