

AIMONI CAPTURES SKI JUMP HONORS

Keller Is 2d at Rosendale
—Zelanakis Injured

ROSENDALE, N. Y., Jan. 26
—Giacomo Aimoni, the three-time Italian national champion, turned in flights of 210 and 208 feet to win the second half of the Rosendale Outing Club's international ski jump today.

The 29-year-old Olympian finished with 214 points to edge West Germany's Franz Keller, who compiled 210.5 points on jumps of 210 and 201 feet.

Ludvick Zajc, the Yugoslav champion and twice an Olympian, placed third with 203.5 points as European stars dominated the tournament for the second straight day.

Today proved unlucky for Dana Zelanakis of Canaan College, Conn., the top American, who placed fourth. On his trial jump Zelanakis soared 208 feet but took a header on the outrun. He was shaken, but did not withdraw.

His first official jump of 209 feet and 46.5 form points put him in contention, but on his second try he landed on his face after jumping 205 feet on the outrun, knocked unconscious and was rushed to a Kingston Hospital, where he was reported to have suffered severe facial bruises and lacerations, but no fractures.
