Secretary's Report: Minutes of the last meeting were distributed and reviewed. Carol made a motion to accept the minutes. Joan seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously. Welcomed a new member, Linnea.

Treasurer's Report: JoAnn reported that there was no treasurer report this meeting. There has been more income than expenses. The first quarter report will be presented at the May meeting.

Old Business:

- a. **DP Imagination Library Program Update:** Eileen H reported that the committee developed a flyer and registration form. Ann has registered the first child in the program. The library is planning a "soft launch" to get the system up and running smoothly. Katie plans to send out the information about this program in a town wide mailing that will go out at the end of March or beginning of April. Ann will collect the registration forms and enter them into the DPIL system. Children entered before the end of March will receive their first book in May. Carol shared a registration forms that are also available in Spanish.
- b. **FRL** web page update: Rebecca reported that she has the website framework up. We want to leave the old webpage up so it will redirect anyone using the old link to the new web page. She is doing some content revision this week and will be putting up information about the garden tour. There will be a few tweaks to work out as the year goes on.
- c. **Scholarship Applications:** Applications were mailed out to Kingston, Rondout and New Paltz high schools. None have been received back so far, but they are not due until April 14th. The applications are available on line or at the front desk. Judith Minissali has generously donated the money for the scholarship in memory of her husband F-stop and increased the amount to \$1,200.
- d. **Garden Tour Update:** A new poster has been made by Rebecca. The date is June 10th from 10-4. We are going to be asking people to donate plants and baked goods to be sold at the registration table. There is also going to be a 50/50 raffle. If anyone has a suggestion of a garden to tour, please let the committee know.
- e. **Book Discussion:** The next book discussion will be April 23rd. The book is The Seed Keeper by Diane Wilson.
- f. **Little Free Library:** We have had a little free library donated to us. We had decided to install it at the Municipal building. We will need a way to affix it to the ground. We will wait for Judith to return to the area in April to contact the Town as she made the original arrangements. She can also see if the town highway department would install it.

New Business

a. **Museum Passes:** Ann renewed the passes for the Maritime Museum. The Friends decided to buy a package of 40 tickets to the Museum of Natural History. We will limit 4 tickets per family per year. This will be announced in the library's newsletter. There is a program from the Ulster County Library Association called Tixkeeper. This provides free passes that can be printed at

home or in the library to members of Ulster county libraries to a variety of museums including Bethel Woods, FDR, Olana, Opus40. More details to follow about this website and how to access these passes.

- b. **April and May Enews:** Ann will remind Allison to remove the Amazon Smile banner as the program was discontinued. April book discussion, link to new website, Garden Tour, scholarship application, Dolly Parton Imagination Library Program. May Garden Tour, DPIL, announcement of scholarship winner.
- 5. **Library Board of Trustees Report:** Rose Unes reported on the Library listening sessions. There were 3 sessions held. A summary report was distributed explaining what was discussed. Katie plans to write an article about these sessions and submit it to the newspaper.

Next FRL meeting: It is tentatively scheduled for May 13th. Eileen Hall and Mary Potratz will be absent. Ann Sarrantonio offered to chair the meeting, but she may also be out of town. There was discussion to move the meeting to a weekday afternoon at 5:30 that week. A final decision will be made by the end of April.

Secretary's report: Minutes from the last meeting were distributed and reviewed. Carol made a motion to accept the minutes. Joan seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously. Meeting dates were set for the year: March 11, May 13, July 8, September 9, November 11. Barbara requested that we send a card and a plant to Terry Rowen for all his years of tending to the gardens around the library. He is no longer doing this due to health issues. All agreed.

Election of Officers.: The slate proposed for a 2 year term is Mary Potratz as Vice President and JoAnn Reuben for treasurer. Eileen H made a motion to accept the slate. Barbara seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Treasurer's report: The proposed 2023 budget, 2022 budget analysis and the 4th quarter treasurer's report were distributed. JoAnn reviewed the treasurer's report 10/1/22-12/31/22. She reported that the interest rate in Capital One accounts is now 3%. The review of our 2022 budget showed our actual income was higher than our expenses.

The proposed 2023 budget was then discussed. Katie had requested that money for programming be increased for this year. More funds were also added to the outreach line. A line was added for Capital Campaign so as things come up we can spend money on what is needed. The postage line was increased to \$200 since the cost of stamps is increasing. Our income from fundraising will include only 2 events this year - Garden Tour and Frozendale. Eileen H and Joan will co-chair both events. Barbara spoke with Jeanne Walsh who wants to bring Frozendale back to a town wide event this year. Joan made a motion to accept the 2023 budget with the changes to the postage line. Lou seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Old business:

Scholarship: Barbara reported that this year we are working with 3 schools since Coleman High school closed. Judith committed to donate the money for the scholarship and will write a bio on F-Stop to be included in the application and in the enews. Katie suggested that we send out a press release about the F-Stop scholarship. Three volunteers to read the applications are Eileen M., Carol and Rebecca.

Dolly Parton Imagination Library Program: Eileen H applied for a Children's Literacy grant for the DPIL and the Summer Reading Program from the Bank of Greene County Charitable. We got approved as an affiliate of the DPIL program and are ready to start it up. Eileen H. will set up a meeting with in the next few weeks. The volunteers for this committee are Katie, Carol, Florence, Eileen H. and Ann. The program is aimed at any child age 0-5 in the town of Rosendale.

FRL webpage update and redesign: Rebecca has a draft done of the website and is looking at a more action oriented website. She is going to send out access to the website redesign via email to the active members of the Friends.

Little Free Library: Judith reported that people are dumping books in the Little Free Library and she has had to clean it out several times. Katie will make a sign that will say "take a book, leave a book." Joanie will check the little library while Judith is in Florida. We want to consider another little library at the town hall. Barbara volunteered she would take care of that one for the 7 months she is in town. Judith was interviewed for a local magazine called "Mountains" and they featured a picture of our little free library in the article.

Garden Tour and Frozendale events: The first meeting of the Garden Tour volunteers will be January 23rd. No date for the tour has been set but there are several dates available in June.

Book Discussion: The book selected is *Horse* by Geraldine Brooks and the date is February 26th. at 2:00pm at the library.

New Business:

Food pantry donation delivery: Ann asked for a volunteer to bring food donations to the food pantry from the library. Judith, Chris and Mary volunteered for this.

February and March Enews: included will be the book discussion, Garden Tour and scholarship information.

Library Board of Trustees report:

Katie reported on the library relocation proposal. Katie spoke about exploring the option of moving to the Belltower. A negative publicity campaign has already started. We need very vocal supporters. The library has information sessions planned for the public in February.

- Secretary's Report: Minutes of the last Friends meeting were distributed and reviewed. Joan made a motion to accept the minutes. Florence seconded the motion. Lou abstained from voting. Motion passed with the remainder of the friends accepting.
- 2. **Treasurer's Report**: The quarterly report and the Budget Analysis were distributed and reviewed by JoAnn. We are up to 2.1% interest on Capital One accounts. JoAnn stated that money from the appeal letter has been coming in. We are no longer separating out the money received from sale of tote bags or onesies. All money from the ongoing sales will be kept in the same envelope. We need to pay sale tax on items from ongoing sales but money from a one time event does not pay sale tax. JoAnn adjusted the assignment of income based on a decision by the Executive Committee to no longer assign income from Amazon Bookseller and the Booktique to the Capital Campaign account. This was an agreement made at the request of the former director based on the fact that Library staff were providing the labor for these activities. That is no longer the case so all income from these activities will go into the FRL general funds moving forward. After brief discussion, this action was approved by those present at the meeting.

3. Old Business:

- a. **Crazy calendar raffle**: We did very well as the raffle made \$2517. Joan reported thinking of a different type of raffle for next year. We will discuss this more at the January meeting as we develop the budget for 2023.
 - b. Little Library: no report this meeting. Eileen will follow up with Judith.
- c. **Dolly Parton Imagination Library Program**: Katie got in touch with them and we got the information. There are 237 children between birth and age 5 in the town of Rosendale. 65% of that population is 154 children that we want to service. It is estimated that the first year of the program we will meet 20% of the eligible pool and every year it will increase by 20%. The cost will be \$2.10 per month per child. Katie offered to have the Friends ask the Foundation of the Bank of Greene County to help fund this project. Friends will do outreach for the program. Carol and Florence volunteered to coordinate events to sign up the children next year.
- d. **Frozendale:** Joan gave an update on the plans. There are 2 raffle baskets that we have collected items for.- creating cupcakes and kids crafts. Mary will put these baskets together to display at the library next week. We have a third basket donated by Rachel Callan. Members signed up to distribute flyers. Joan did a media blast and JoAnn posted a notice on the website about the event. Joan and Joe will put signs out. Christine spoke about her book and will speak about it and sign copies at the event. She offered to donate \$10 to the library from each book sold.

- e. **FRL website update**: Eileen H reported that Rebecca and Katie are working on this. The goal is to have it up by the first of the year.
- f. Appeal letter: The letter went out in the mail and money has begun to come in.

4. New Business

- a. **Picklefest funding request**: The library will apply for money to fund senior programming events. The singing at the senior apartment complex was popular and the funding will be used to do this monthly.
- b. **December and January newsletter**: The December enews should have info on Frozendale and a link to the appeal letter. In the January enews, we may be ready to include an announcement about the Dolly Parton Imagination Library Program.
- c. **Amazon Book Seller**: Eileen reported that we could close the account and sell any leftover books in the basement to a used book store. The Friends wanted more information about how many books are left in the basement and their value before making a decision. Eileen will report on this at the next meeting.
- 5. **Library Board of Trustees Report**: Rachel reported that the Board is impressed with the work done by the Friends and thanks us for our work. Katie has been chosen as the next president of the Ulster County Library Association .

- Secretary Report: Minutes of the last Friend's meeting were distributed and reviewed. JoAnn made a correction about the proceeds from the Garden Tour. \$1250 proceeds from ads were applied to the Capital Campaign and \$1555 proceeds from ticket sales were applied to the General Fund. Joan made a motion to accept the amended minutes. Rebecca seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.
- 2. Treasurer's report: JoAnn reported that she reviewed the credit card expenses and found expenses from the Garden Tour that were not added to last meeting's report. The \$207.92 expenses included credit card fees, ads and signs. Final proceeds from the event are now \$2575.05

 JoAnn reported that the interest rate at Capital One has increased to 1.21%.

3. Old Business

- a. Crazy calendar raffle update: Joan reported that we had good ticket sales at the 3 Farmers Markets. 60 people bought tickets over the 3 days there totaling \$1085. We printed and sold a total of 340 tickets for a profit of \$2517. The group suggested that we post a thank you to the local businesses on our Facebook page.
- b. Little Free Library in Cottekill: Judith had approached the town supervisor about locating a LFL at the town complex on Lucas Ave. The FRLasked who uses the playground at the building and if there is a flow of traffic near the playground. It is noticed that there is an increase in traffic due to the use of the pickle ball courts. Judith will ask about this at the next town meeting.
- c. Fall book discussion: The next discussion is Sunday September 25th at 2:00pm. The book chosen is "The Lincoln Highway."
- d. Library Notecards and Onesies: We have notecards available for sale so we don't need to make more now. It was approved to order more onesies. We'll only be ordering sizes 6 and 12 months. The larger sizes did not sell well. Katie will develop the graphic for a new silk screen.

4. New Business

a. FRL webpage update: We want to increase our presence in the E- news. Eileen H and Ann talked to Katie and it was felt we need to have links to our

- news and programs in the E-news. A committee was formed to update and redesign our web page in order to do this. The committee members are Eileen H, JoAnn, Rebecca, Joan, Ann and Katie. They will be meeting on 9/20 at 4:00 at the library.
- b. Dolly Parton Imagination Library Program: Katie wants to know if the Friends want to buy into this program. It cost \$2.10 per child per month. It would target children who don't come to the library. We want to ask Katie if she wants the friends to fund the program or help staff it. The friends would like to fund it. Florence offered to donate money to this program. There was discussion about asking people to sponsor families and if there should be a cap on the number of children who could participate.
- c. Books for Babies: We are out of books to make new packets. We need to buy more books and Ann reported that we buy 20 at a time from Postmark Books. Judith, Barbara, Mary and Rebecca volunteered to put the book kits together.
- d. Photobook fundraiser: Ann met with Christine Hunter who is putting together a photo essay book about local people who live above their stores in Rosendale. Do the Friends want to sponsor a book launch event. It was decided we need more information. Ann will contact Christine for more information.
- e. Membership letter: Last year the letter was mailed bulk mail in November. Bulk mail costs less money per item and last year Katie requested that we send it out to a larger list of patrons. Bulk mailing requires a lot of organization to meet PO rules and given the size of mailing, it costs a significant amount of money. Eileen and Ann will look into how many people who are not on a smaller donor list made donations to last year's letter and decide whether it makes financial sense to do the much larger mailing. Eileen will write the letter again this year and have them mailed by mid-November.
- f. October and November E news: For the November enews, we will need to write about plans for Frozendale at the library December 3rd. For October, an item noting the financial results of the raffle and thanking everyone who donated items and/or bought raffle tickets.
- 5. Board of Trustees report: Jacky reported that the budget passed 68 to 1. There are 2 new board members- Justin Peone and Lauren Miller. Ann and Tanya from the Women's studio collective agreed to be part of the Garden Tour next year. Tanya's book which the library had put aside in the basement sold for \$2,000.

Secretary's Report

Minutes of the last meeting were reviewed. Joan made a motion to accept the minutes. Mary seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Treasurer's report

- a. JoAnn reported that she paid out \$916.31 for the last newsletter mailing, \$802.34 for the tote bags and \$360 to renew service for 3 hotspots.
- b. We have received \$1995 in capital donations this past quarter. The grand total for the Fall appeal letter is \$10,724 which will be available to help to cover the construction grant expenses.
- c. Donations made via PayPal go into the checking account but have an expense that is paid to PayPal. JoAnn questioned whether the net amount should be transferred into the capital campaign. She will talk to the accountant for advice on this.
- d. Eileen H. suggests that we do not send a spring appeal letter this year since we are still getting donations from the Fall appeal. Florence suggested not sending a letter during tax season when people may not have money to send. It was agreed that there will be no spring appeal letter this and we will review it when we develop next year's budget.
- e. Discussion of the Amazon Fire Tablet: JoAnn reported that we purchased the tablet but it will only accept apps from Amazon. We can't use PayPal or Zettle apps on this tablet so it will not serve our needs to use for credit cards. JoAnn reported that she set up an old phone to accept credit card payments instead. There was discussion on what to do with the Amazon tablet and it was decided to put it into the Crazy Calendar Raffle as a prize. Joan asked if we sell raffle tickets at the Farmer's Market or other local locations can we use this phone to accept credit card payments. It was decided we can do that.

Old Business

- a. Book Cellar: Joan reported on the status of the book cellar. All paperback books are boxed, there are a few hard cover books left to scan. We can start to recycle some paperbacks at the library. Ann will call the Jim Wipf at the Bruderhoff to set up a time to bring the hard cover books to the Ulster dump and the paperbacks to recycling.
- b. Garden Tour fundraiser: Eileen H reported she was able to elicit great people to join the planning committee Victoria Coyne, Kit Goldpaugh, Barbara Piombino and a new member of the Friends, Rebecca Rodriguez. We have confirmed 6 gardens for the tour. The date of the tour is June 18th 10-4. Tickets are \$25 in advance or \$30 on the day of the tour. Participants will pick up a booklet at the library that will

include garden descriptions and a map. We are selling ads in the booklet to sponsor the tour. Rebecca is designing a poster. Katie suggested using Google Forms linked to PayPal to register people for the tour.

- c. Crazy Calendar Raffle: Joan reported the raffle will take place during the month of September. We will choose one winner a day for 30 days. An email is being sent out to all Friends asking everyone to sell 5 tickets and asking for donations of quality gifts. Tickets will be \$10 for one and \$5 for a second ticket, and \$35 for 5 tickets.
- d. Little Library in Tillson: This is part of the Library Service Action plan. Joan reported that a good location in Tillson would be across from the old Tillson Market. It would work well if the vacant market reopens as a cafe. Joan also looked at spots in Cottekill. We are putting this project on hold for now.
- e. Gazebo and Shed update: Katie reported that we still need a surveyor for the shed placement to identify the exact location of the property line on the Central Ave side of the libary. A drawing is needed to submit to the Building Inspector to get a building permit. There is more ARPA money available. The maximum we can apply for is \$50,000. We will apply for \$5,000 for programming and \$45,000 for a capital grant. Katie encouraged everyone to reach out to our representatives (Delgado, Martucci, Cahill) to ask for renovation money from the budget.

New Business

- a. April newsletter: Include information on the Garden tour and the April book discussion.
- b. April Book discussion: The book discussion date is April 24th on *Island at the Center of the World* by Russell Shorto.

Library Board report

The policy committee is meeting to discuss and update the indoor masking policy and updating the COVID policy. Ann reports that the patrons "love" the new fine free policy.

1. Election of President and Secretary.

There was a motion to accept the slate of Eileen Hall and Eileen Meltzer. Motion passed unanimously. Eileen Hall President and Eileen Meltzer Secretary for a term of 2 years.

2. Secretary's report

Minutes of the last Friend's meeting were reviewed. Lou made a motion to accept the minutes. JoAnn seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

3. Treasurer's report

A. Quarterly report reviewed.:

Expenses are large due to the payment of the pledged Capital Campaign donation and printing of the fundraising letter. We had voted last year to donate \$25,000 toward the expenses of the NYS Library Construction grant. Our income would be larger than our expenses if the \$25,000 donation was not included. JoAnn reported that any money donated on line goes directly into our checking account and then she has to move the money into Capital One savings accounts. The total amount of money donated on line was \$3960 which decreased to \$3862 due to paying PayPal fees.

B .Budget analysis: 2021

The budget was modified several times during the year. Our income was close to what we anticipated and our expenses were less. There was no membership letter this year due to the fundraising appeal letter sent instead. Our biggest expense was equipment for the library. Eileen H reported that we have been very flexible over the past year due to the library closing due to the Pandemic. FRL funding for library programming has also changed due to more funding for programming in the library budget.

C. 2022 Budget:

Discussion of expenses for the year: We need to include \$1200 to cover the loss of anticipated book fines for the year. There was a discussion of the postage line in the budget. Eileen H. explained the difference between outreach postage and the Friend's business postage. We will need a line for Capital Campaign expenses to include postage, printing and mailing. We need \$700 for each library newsletter mailing. We will add \$2000 to the line since we don't know exactly what we will need. The canvas bags need to be added to the budget for \$800 to be paid this month. Katie reported that she would like to replace a MAC computer for our patrons who don't use PC's. We could move some money out of the equipment line which would decrease that item to \$1400. The scholarship line will be decreased to \$1000 to give a scholarship to 1 student since the additional 2 scholarships are no longer being funded by the Bowens. Judith Minissali will once again donate \$1,000 for the scholarship, in memory of her husband F-Stop. Judith asked a question about the community bulletin board kiosk usage. Katie reported that when the parking lot is expanded the board will be taken down.

Discussion of Income for the year: We anticipate \$1000 income from outdoor book sales which will take place from the new shed and in the gazebo. We plan to take in \$6000 from the appeal letter. It will no longer be called a membership letter. We will increase the price of the canvas bag to \$12 starting this Monday. We will need to add \$2475 from our savings account to balance the budget.

Joan made a motion to accept the budget. Mary seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

4. Old Business:

- a. Frozendale and Raffle Baskets report. Ann reported that we did very well. WE thanked Joanie for her hard work on this event. The funds that had been donated for books in the bookcellar, combined with Frozendale book, gift items and raffle sales totaled \$1,073.
- b. Book cellar closeout: We are officially closed as of today. Lou has packed up many boxes to send to Better World Books. Joanie will take any leftover children's books and store them to be used for the Little Library. We need to have volunteers to scan more books to be sent to Better World Books before we dispose of the books remaining in the basement. Joan, Mary and Lou volunteered to scan more books. We will ask Woodcrest if they could haul the unwanted books out to be recycled or put in the landfill. Ann will check on the requirements for recycling and dumping and coordinate this.
- c. Gazebo and shed update: Katie reports that Eric Friedman staked out an area where they will put the gazebo and shed but we need an accurate drawing of the property lines before completing the application for a building permit. The permit must be issued before the site preparation work can be done. We have a surveyor who will do this without charge this month.

5. New Business:

- A. Library tote bags: we received 100 bags which are already being sold at the front desk. The price will increase to \$12 starting Monday.
- B. Fundraising plans: Eileen H and Joan attended an online MHLS program outlining Friends fundraising ideas. There were some good ideas and we chose 2 ideas for our Friend's group. Crazy Calendar Raffle- Eileen M, Joan and Mary will work on this. Garden Tours-Joan, Judith and Eileen H will work on this. Both subcommittees will report back at the March meeting.
- C. Turning Out Action Plan: One of the action for 2022 is developing a volunteer program. The library staff and the FRL will work together on this objective. The FRL will also investigate installing another Free Little Library in the Tillson or another hamlet outside the village of Rosendale. The FRL appreciate that the Library finally has a strategic plan with concrete steps.
- D. Book Discussion: The next discussion is February 27th. The book selection is <u>Harlem Shuffle</u> by Colson Whitehead. The discussion will be in person or on Zoom depending on public health concerns.
- E. Books for Babies: We have 9 left. We may need to restock later this year.
- 6. **Library Board Report**. Beth King reports that the library Board has a new President Sheila Dixon and a new Vice President Jacky Davis. Beth reports that on behalf of the Board she

thanks the Friends for our support. She thanked Eileen H and JoAnn for attending the Board meetings. She thanked the Friends who participated in the Turning Out program.

2. Treasurer's Report-report 7/1/2021-9/30/21 was distributed

The news is good. Our income is greater than our expenses.

Elimination of Book Fines 2022: The library going "fine free" was discussed. Katie reported that in 2019 \$1600 in fines was collected for late items including \$1 per day for videos. Also in 2019 \$200 was collected in replacement fees. Over the past 2 years DVD use has decreased and the video fine was reduced to 25 cents a day. So far in 2021 \$641 in fines have been collected. Katie estimates that the average for this year will be \$1225. \$53 has been collected so far in replacement fees. In order to be fine free next year, the library will need an additional \$1200 added to the budget. In future years, the Board of Trustees will adjust the budget to account for this lost revenue.

The Friends decided we could make up the \$1200 difference in the 2022 budget for the Library. Eileen M. made a motion to make up the difference. Lou seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Katie suggested eliminating the replacement fee for Rosendale residents for children books only from our collection. Also Katie discussed the idea that the library will issue a bill when the material is over a month late. The bill will ask for the cost of replacement but if the material is returned there will only be a \$2 fee. When books from other libraries are not returned the policy of the other library will need to be followed. Other libraries have found the circulation goes up when following a fine free policy. It has a positive impact on usage. Craig (representing the board) feels strongly that the Board will adopt this policy.

3. Old Business

Fall appeal letter- The letter has been printed seeking donations to cover the unfunded part of the NYS Library Construction Grant. 950 letters will be sent out at bulk rate. Volunteers will meet at the Library this Wednesday to address and seal the envelopes.

Frozendale and Raffle Baskets- Nancy Tuller brought in another bag of knitted items to sell. 2 Raffle baskets donated by the Friends and 2 baskets donated by Rachel Callen from Indigo Books were put together by Mary are on display. Ann will ask Alison to send out an Ebulletin and post pictures of the baskets on our Facebook page. Joan reported that we will sell small gift items and knit items at Frozendale on 12/4/21. Cookies will be donated by the Bruderhof. There will be children stories read. Joan will put up a sign across from Stewart's. A signup sheet was passed around for volunteers that day. The raffle baskets will be drawn at the end of the day.

Book cellar- A lot of the basement is cleaned out and looks good Thank you to Joan and Eileen. Patrons are going into the basement everyday to look and buy books.

4. New Business

Library tote bags- We have 9 bags left and need to restock our supply. We can order 100 now to be received in January. Joan made a motion to take the funds from the savings account to pay for them. Barbara seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Tablet for credit card- JoAnn bought a Kindle Fire for \$57. The Friends can reimburse JoAnn from the office supply budget.

Quilt donation- Juanita Yarter donated a beautiful queen size handmade quilt to the library. It was decided to offer it for sale and ask for a minimum price of \$300.

Library Board report- Craig thanked the Friends for all their work. He also thanked Katie for the great job she is doing as director.

Treasurer's report

2nd quarter report was reviewed. JoAnn reported that interest rates for the savings accounts t Capitol One are dropping. She had inquired at the bank about their change in rates and they had no answer to why it happened. It was decided by the Friends to not make any changes now due to a low amount of money being made in interest in our accounts.

The budget was amended in several areas. The \$3000 scholarship expense line was changed to \$2000 and the scholarship income was changed to \$1000. Treasurer's report:

\$5090 will still need to be transferred from savings into the budget. Eileen M made a motion to accept the new budget. Joan seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Katie suggested to send out an appeal letter. Eileen H and JoAnn volunteered to write the letter. The specific goal will be raise \$5,000. This will be a separate appeal from the annual membership letter.

Katie also proposed building an outdoor pavilion or gazebo that could be used by patrons to access wi-fi when the building is closed or to avoid being inside for health safety concerns. Amount paid for postage is not projected to increase and PO Box will increase. When we need a large number of fliers printed we will use Staples- otherwise, we will use the library printer for smaller numbers.

Katie spoke about sharing fees with other libraries to offer on-line programs to the public. We will leave money in the budget for possible outdoor programs this summer and fall. Katie requested money for library equipment to lend to the public such as mobile hotspots and laptops. Other libraries are doing this. Policies and procedures for lending equipment will need to be developed by the Board of Trustees. Equipment budget was increased to \$3000. Katie reports that a college student was working on digitizing the local history files. The local history budget expense line will be deleted in this year's budget.

There is no projected income this year from our usual book sales. We expect donations again from the membership letter. We expect income from Frozendale if that event happens this year. We will do the raffle baskets even if we are still only doing curbside. Ann will put a Library tote bag outside to advertise that bags are available for purchase. We have about 20 bags left.

There was an attachment of the budget analysis emailed to the Friends prior to the meeting.

<u>Secretary's Report</u>- Minutes were reviewed. Motion to accept by Howard M., seconded by Eileen H. **Empire Friends Newsletter** was circulated, it has some great ideas from Friends groups around the state. Craig Z. will take it to the Library Board meeting to discuss the Annual Report to the public. We received a thank you card from Kathy Wade. Cindy E. was given the mail from the NYS Attorney General's office (just a political flyer). This was addressed to Mary Susan Lynch so Ann S. sent them an email to correct their mailing list.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>- Treasurer's reports are generated quarterly so there wasn't a formal printed one at this meeting. Jo Ann mentioned that we gave \$17,000 to the Library Board for the Rug/Painting project. She wondered if the board will be asking for more money soon for the water leak repair. Jo Ann needs to know so she can decide whether to renew one of our CDs that is coming due in early July. She won't renew if the board needs access to that money soon. Craig will find out.

Florence S. asked how much the Board has left in the building and maintenance budget line? Cindy and Jo Ann will alternate going to the Library Board meetings every month. Jo Ann will go in June and Cindy in July.

Old Business- Books For Babies- Eileen H. made 20 kits, they are available at the library desk. Mary P. will take some to the Physicians office in Rosendale to be given out to expecting and new parents. When we need another batch Ann S. will contact Inquiring Minds in New Paltz and ask for a special order of inexpensive board books. FRL Membership Brochures-Eileen H. is working with Ameriprint on designing a new brochure. We picked colors (burgundy, blue and pale yellow). Eileen will ask them to send us a mock up in color. They charge: Design:\$100 (one time fee), 500 brochures for \$280, 1,000 brochures for \$540. We voted on 500 for now. FRL Scholarship Raffle- Eileen M. will decorate the prize display. Ann will update last year's flyer and notify FRL to come in and post. Ann will check the week before our Book Sale to see if more tickets need to be printed. July 26 Book Sale- The Book Sale will be 10-3, NO RAIN DATE. Ann will make a shift list and post at the desk, update last year's book sale flyer (include Kids get one free book.), contact Terry Rowen and Anne Coleman about borrowing their tents. We need volunteers to pre-sort incoming used books before the sale. When flyers are ready email will be sent to all FRL so that all can help

post. We need to discuss prices for this year. Howard M. asks if this is a fundraiser why are the prices so low?

She answered questions and gave us the outline: -Moving (bookshelves and other large items out and back in) \$8,600 Painting: \$5,225 -Carpet removal and replacement: either \$7,688 or \$10,723 (for thicker better quality) Total for the whole project = \$25,000. Library Board can fund \$5,000 from bldg.improv. budget line and \$2,000 from repair line plus \$1,000 for Lee (technology moving). The board is asking FRL for \$15,000 or \$18,000. Afterward the board and FRL will have a fundraising campaign to regain some funds.
